Class 1

Class 4

This week Class 4 have been acting as inventors/entrepreneurs to pitch their solutions for clearing the world's oceans of plastic. The children worked together to create presentations to showcase their design and persuade the rest of the class why it should be manufactured, before voting on which design was their favourite. In Maths, we have continued to practise our division skills - Year 5 are now confident in using the 'bus stop' method and Year 6 are starting to get to grips with long division. We have also completed some work on decimal numbers. In Literacy, we wrote audio commentaries for a tour of our school using relative clauses.
