Class 1

This week Class One have been learning about symmetry and have used our skills to apply what we have learnt into a variety of tasks. Class 2

Class 2 have been learning about division in Maths this week, using knowledge of our times tables to help us to work out the calculations. In Literacy, we have continued with our story 'Wing It' and used ideas from it to help us to write an adventure story. For our Computing lesson, we used Purple Mash to create an impressionism picture of a sunrise in the style of Claude Monet. We then used watercolour paints in our Art lesson to do the same thing and compared the two. We are still enjoying playing in our Travel Agents. This week class 3 have written diary entries, detailing their feelings about the first time they did something. We have looked at life in the Iron Age in Humanities and worked with symmetry, perimeter and angles during Maths. Class 4

This week Year 6 have been exploring the order of mathematical operations, using BODMAS, whilst Year 5 have been practising different methods of subtraction. We have continued to read *Friend or Foe*, paying particular attention to how characters use standard and non-standard English. In Geography we have been looking at the different counties of the United Kingdom and in Computing we created spreadsheets to calculate the area and perimeter of rectangles.

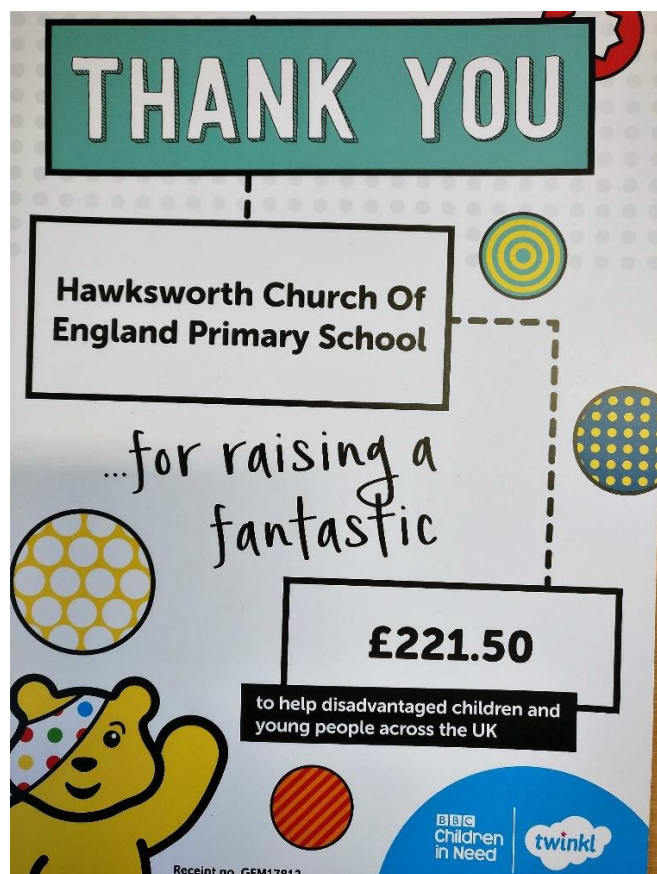
Reminder
