The weather was perfect and there was a great community spirit in evidence as the children walked from Station Road up the main street, passed St Oswald's Church, the stocks, along Oxford Road and back down to Station Road. The children's costumes looked great and it appeared the turnout of pupils was much greater than many of the other local schools. Thank you to those parents and Grandparents who accompanied the children in the parade and to those who waved from the pavements along the route. I would also like to thank Mrs Gallagher, Miss Hewitt, Mrs Metcalfe, Miss Moir and Mrs Oliver who all gave up their free time to attend and were willing to dress up as WPCs!

<u>Sports Day</u> Monday was our annual school sports day and thankfully the downpour during lunchtime stopped as quickly as it had started. The day was planned and organised by Mr Hall of Velocity Sports (our PE Specialist and Spanish Teacher) and the changed format has received a favourable response from parents and staff. The introduction of archery and air rockets were obviously enjoyed by the children and I know Mr Hall has plans to further enhance the Sports Day experience for 2020. The Revd Andrew Howorth (Associate Priest Menston with Woodhead and Chaplain at Bradford University) made a visit to Hawksworth and talked to Classes 3 and 4 about his charity work for refugees in his capacity as a local priest. The children were very interested to hear about the Refugee Ration Challenge which he had recently completed – living on the following ingredients for a week: Rice 420g, Lentils 170g, Dried chickpeas 85g, Tinned sardines 120g, Tinned kidney beans 400g and Vegetable oil 330ml and raising money to fund the work of Concern Worldwide (UK) with refugees and internally displaced people in countries like Syria, Lebanon, Turkey, South Sudan, the Democratic Republic of Congo and Bangladesh.

<u>Leavers' Service 2019</u> Yesterday, our Year Six pupils with Mr Roche and Mrs Dowling attended the annual Leavers' Service at Bradford Cathedral with other Year Six children from twelve primary schools within the local diocese. Each school created their own rainbow promises which are now displayed in Bradford Cathedral. Mr Roche, informed me the children displayed exemplary behaviour and were outstanding ambassadors for the school. Thank you to Mrs Gallagher for helping the children create their rainbow promise artwork.

Art Exhibition 2019 Mrs Gallagher and Miss Ward have been doing an excellent job in recent weeks teaching art lessons across both Key Stages and the work the children have created will be displayed in the upcoming Art Exhibition organised by the Aireborough Learning Partnership Trust, which we are a member of. The artwork inspired by the word 'Joy' is to be displayed at Trinity Church, Rawdon on Tuesday, July 9th and Wednesday, July 10th. The artwork is actually being set up on Friday, July 5th so the church's congregation can view it beforehand. It has been created by pupils from the Trust's primary schools plus its two secondary schools, Guiseley School and Benton Park. Children from all the schools will be visiting the exhibition over the two days and working together on a project which will involve making an animation from clay models. The ALPT choir, featuring children from most of the schools plus a band from Benton Park, will also be performing 'songs of joy' at 5.30pm on the Tuesday evening in what will be their debut performance. The music will then be used as a backing track for the animation. The exhibition runs from 9.15am to 6.30pm on the Tuesday and from 9.15am to 4.30pm on the Wednesday...and I would urge parents to make a visit to see this brilliant artwork!

<u>School Reports</u> In previous years end of year school reports have been handed to the children or placed in their school bags but this year we are asking parents to collect them directly from the school office. The reason for this change is due to GDPR regulations as the reports are classed as personal data which includes attendance records, behaviour and progress reports. See below an excerpt from one of many lengthy GDPR guides for schools which I receive:

'Personal data comprises any information that can help identify a person or their family. In school records, this would be their name, their address, their contact details, their disciplinary records, as well as their marks and progress reports. This sort of data remains "personal" even if an individual chooses to publicise it...... Pupil progress reports include personal information relating to pupils. Schools must take reasonable measures to safeguard this information. Pupil progress reports should be distributed in a way that ensures that the information is secure. Sending Pupil Progress Reports home in schoolbags is not recommended'.

As a school we take our GDPR responsibilities seriously. Staff and governors have received GDPR training and we take care our data is kept secure. We have even taken the precaution of 'frosting' our office and staffroom windows so no information can be seen from outside. The governors and I would not want to experience a 'data breach' or have the school faced with the consequences of a breach. The end of year reports will be available to collect from the school office on Thursday 18th July (from 8:15am until 4:30pm) and on Friday 19th July from 8:15am until 4:00pm. If you believe you will not able to pick them up on those days, please contact Miss Hewitt as soon as possible and we will arrange to post the report to your home address.

<u>Calendar Change</u> Please note the revised 2019/20 Calendar was sent to all parents as the May bank holiday has been changed from Monday 4th May to Friday 8th May to coincide with the 75th anniversary of VE Day.


