School News

Coronavirus

As a school we understand that parents are naturally worried due to the current Coronavirus pandemic. We are and have been following all recommendations from the DfE and receive updates daily on the correct procedures as the information changes.

As a school we take our responsibilities for the well-being of the pupils very seriously and this is why I instructed Miss Hewitt to order large amounts of Anti-bacteria gel (with 60% alcohol content) and liquid soap. This order was processed three weeks ago and it means we do have sufficient stock which will last for a long period. I would also like to point out a deep clean was carried out during the February half-term. The cleaners (as they have always done) spray all door handles and surfaces with an anti-bacteria solution. On 24TH February 2020 we also had all of our old hand dispensers in the toilets replaced with new ones which are more children friendly. Miss Hewitt checks the levels of soap in the dispensers every morning and at the end of the school day and if any are near empty they are topped up by the cleaning team. During the day the children are being constantly reminded by all staff to follow the guidance when cleaning their hands and if any of the soap/gel dispensers are low during the day to inform a member of staff so it can be topped up (we have spare canisters in the front office for this purpose).

If any parents have any concerns relating to coronavirus/school procedures please email or phone school rather than uploading comments onto social media which may be based on presumptions or incorrect information - as this will just cause unnecessary anxiety for all parents.

Below is an excerpt from the most recent advice for Leeds Headteachers:

'One of the announcements made by the government yesterday was that anyone with a new, persistent cough or a high temperature is advised to self-isolate for seven days. Until the DfE issues any national guidance on this, our advice to schools is to remain open where possible (advice from Public Health England continues to be for education and children's social care settings to remain open, unless advised otherwise). If schools have a situation where a number of staff members are self-isolating, it is up to individual headteachers to determine if they have sufficient remaining staff to safely keep their school open. I hope no school is in a position where it needs to close however in the event that a school doesn't have enough staff to ensure the health and safety of pupils and has to close, this should be a short term measure and supply staff engaged as soon as possible to ensure that children do not miss out on their education. Schools that do need to close should follow the normal procedure for logging their closure via the Leeds City Council website'.

Kitchen update

The gas engineers came out this morning, completed the agreed works and also issued an updated safety certificate. Leeds Catering have now informed their staff to return to work on Monday so thankfully the school kitchen will now re-open Monday. Next week's menu may have some slight changes due to food deliveries being cancelled. I would like to thank all parents for their understanding in this matter.

Torch-Light Trail

Last Friday's Torch-Light Trail was hugely popular with parents and children. I would like to thank the *Friends of Hawksworth* who did an excellent job of organising this event and making it such a success. I would also like to thank Mrs S. Oliver and Miss Dereix who volunteered to stand in the wood for an hour and a special thanks to Mr Akeroyd (an ex-parent of Hawksworth) who also did an hour in the woods.


Read With a Child It's the Most Important 20 Minutes of Your Day
