Class News

Class 1

This week Class One have enjoyed looking at Google Earth to help the class learn about our local area and where we live. We have been writing and drawing who lives in our house and discussing who we live with, where we live and things in our local areas. In Art Mrs Gallagher taught us about colours, we practised mixing primary colours to make secondary colours. We have been learning about seasons and how Autumn has now begun. In Maths, Year 1 have been using a part whole model to help us to practise our knowledge of addition, subtraction and numbers bonds. While Reception have explored lots of number activities and games. We are really proud of all the Reception children for completing their first full week of school with such maturity and confidence, well done Reception.

Class 2

Class 2 have been continuing their work on place value in Maths, using part-whole models and tens frames to learn their number bonds to 10 and transferring this knowledge into number bonds to 100. We have also been continuing to partition numbers into tens and ones. In Literacy, we have read the story of Cinderella, creating story maps of the main events and writing invitations to the ball. Topic work has continued with writing information about motte and bailey and keep and bailey castles. Could I please ask that reading folders are brought to school every day but especially on a Friday when books will be changed for the following week. Thanks

Class 3

This week in Class 3 we have had a fantastic week immersing ourselves in our Stone Age topic. In Literacy we have focussed on building a vocabulary bank using Power of 3s (adjectives) and powerful verbs. We have done a lot of work around synonyms and discussing how authors create atmosphere in their writing. In Maths this week we have been

continuing our work on number bonds to the nearest 10 and 100 whilst also using this to tackle mental addition and subtraction challenges and word problems. In Humanities this week we found ourselves in a dark and desolate cave where we had to discuss and order what we do in order to survive in the Stone Age. In Science we have been continuing our work on rocks and categorising them into groups using Venn diagrams to help.

Class 4

This week Class 4 have completed two experiments in Science, testing which materials would be best for mopping up spills and investigating which rocks are the hardest. We looked at Mohs' scale of hardness and re-capped our knowledge of particles, changing states, and the water cycle from last year. In Maths we worked with decimals, comparing and ordering them, placing them accurately on number lines and solved problems with money. In Literacy we revised our understanding of word classes and the 'jobs' of individual words, which helped us with our comprehension.





Kestrels Before and After School Club News

In Kestrels this week the children drew around their own hands and feet to create this 'optical illusion' of a 3-dimensional person. The body looks further away and their hands and feet look close up as they are bigger! Currently we are working on drawing faces step-by-step so that the features are in proportion and symmetrical:-). We had an exciting Thursday evening, our new outdoor classroom gave us the prefect view of the storm.

Reading Books

We have bought a new reading scheme for use in Classes 1 and 2. This scheme links the child's known phonics to an appropriate reading level. As it is a different scheme to the previous books sent home, it may mean that your child comes home with a different coloured level. This does not necessarily mean that they have moved up or down a level, merely that the level they have been given matches their phonics assessments which have been carried out. Your child will be given two books each week. Class 1 books will go out on a Tuesday and Class 2 on a Friday. This is so that there is enough time to quarantine books between use, therefore, please ensure that your child's books are brought in each day so that they can be read in school and changed on the correct day. If you still have reading books at home which were sent before lockdown, please send them back to school. We still have quite a few books which haven't been returned, particularly from our Jolly Phonics reading scheme which are used as a booster. Thank you for your cooperation
