

We have been practising our cursive handwriting daily, trying to transfer this practice into our Literacy books. It's definitely a challenge! In Maths, we have been re-capping 2D shapes looking to find which we could see in the school grounds, sorting shapes by their properties and finding lines of symmetry. We had to answer the question 'Does the number of sides on a shape match the number of lines of symmetry?' Do you know the answer? We had some great discussions during our mental health activities on Thursday thinking about how things we say and do can affect other people and that saying one nice thing to a person each day will make them feel good inside. We think that's a great motto to live by!

Class 3

We have had a very busy week in Class 3 celebrating both National Poetry Day and Mental Health Day. This week I would like to share with you two examples of the poetry we wrote in Class 3. The theme this year was 'Vision' and we focussed our learning around the poem by Tom Foolery; The Great Realisation. We wrote our own version of this poem and how we can turn even the darkest, strangest of times into something positive. We also continued our learning on partition addition showing this in a variety of ways and answering difficult word challenges around this. In Literacy this week we wrote Fronted Adverbials expressing Time, Manner and Place. In RE this week we have learnt about our wonderful world and how Christian's beliefs may affect the way we care for our world.

Sanitiser

As most schools are experiencing reduced budgets, it is no surprise we are too. Since the start of March and lockdown we have invested heavily in sanitiser, soap, anti-bacterial wipes, PPE equipment, covid-19 spray etc but the stocks deplete very quickly and we have spent around £1,600 pounds so far (and the amount continues to rise). This extra expense comes out of the allocated school budget and as the Department of Education will only allow claims on the following three areas:

- increased premises related costs of keeping schools open over school holiday periods, for vulnerable children and children of critical workers
- support for free school meal (FSM) children who are not attending school, other than through the national voucher scheme
- additional cleaning, over and above existing cleaning arrangements, where you have a suspected or confirmed case of coronavirus (COVID-19)

This has led many schools to ask parents to provide their child with hand sanitiser. We do have stocks left and I will continue to replace the stock but if parents could help us to make our stocks last for longer...it would be greatly appreciated.

Following the car accident in Hawksworth due to speeding I have written to our local MP and councillors. I would like to thank those parents who have also taken time to write emails. Hopefully, these communiques will lead to some positive action.

Lights, camera...action
