The classroom looks great already but both staff members still have the space at the end of the classroom to develop. This area will be used for small group work and house the provision areas.

Class 2's old classroom now lies empty so we will take this opportunity to have it painted and complete some modifications to the toilets. Hopefully, the classroom can be painted either before or the during the Easter holidays and when this is complete Miss Hewitt and I will transfer the furniture and resources from Class 3 to their new home. When Class 3's transfer is complete the Nursery and Kestrels staff will then be able to start to set out their provision.















The rear of the classroom is large and will be started on next week by Mrs Oliver and Mrs Dowling. This area will be used for Y2 provision areas and small group work.



REMINDER

Our school has been selected again to act as a Polling Station for the local elections on **THURSDAY** 6^{TH} **MAY** 2021. This year the school will be closed as the council wanted the 'voting area' to have an entry point and an exit, which meant we would have voters walking through the building. Due to Covid – 19 concerns the school will be closed on polling day for staff and pupils. The day will now be classed as our third training day of five and teaching staff will be training online.

Class 1

This week in Maths we have been measuring in centimetres and metres. We have been finding things that are shorter and longer than a metre, inside the classroom and outside. We have also measured each other. We have been describing aliens in literacy and Year 1 have focused on using adjectives and their senses to write descriptive sentences. We have enjoyed the sun this week and have done lots of outdoor learning. We have done some observational drawings of daffodils and in RE continued our learning of the Easter story. Class 2 have made the permanent move into what was 'The Haven' this week and have settled in well. All areas in the main part of the classroom are set up and Mrs Oliver and Mrs Dowling are working on setting up the play area at the back of the room. We have had a fun week learning a new skill - sewing!! Mrs Oliver and Mrs Dowling however, have found it a challenge constantly re-threading 22 needles! We haven't finished yet but so far the results are amazing and we think you will be extremely impressed. Our RE topic has continued focusing on the Key Question 'Is it true that Jesus came back to life again?' We looked, this week, at Easter symbols. We tasted hot cross buns and an Easter egg and talked about the significance of these at Easter. It's been a busy week! **Mrs Oliver**

Class 3

This week we have further immersed ourselves in the Rainforest Topic where we have learnt all about the persuasive features needed when writing a letter or composing an argument and used our Emotive Language, Rhetorical Questions and carefully selected vocabulary to persuade the Government to stop deforestation. We continued our work around the layers of the Amazon Rainforest and which animals live here, learning about their special adaptations and facts about these amazing animals. In Maths we continued our work around Fractions and moved onto Adding and Subtracting Mixed and Improper Fractions. We are becoming secure in our knowledge with Fractions and the ability to use mathematical language to explain our answers and reasoning. In RE this week, we have created our very own stain glass windows to show the Holy Trinity and how we can represent this through art. We are also thoroughly enjoying swimming and the children have shown exemplary behaviour and manners when visiting Aireborough Leisure Centre. **Mrs Dereix**

Class 4 travelled back in time this week, to experience what it was like to be an evacuee in WWII. Everyone was on tenterhooks awaiting their billet placements. We've been writing postcards home in role as evacuees in literacy. Thinking about life on the Home Front, we have been researching the Land Girls and Home Guard. Everyone has worked really well as a team to create some out-of-this-world collaborative space art. Y6 have really come alive investigating a volume and shape problem in maths, whilst Y5 have shown some real perseverance with one of the trickiest parts of their curriculum: finding the area of rectilinear shapes. *More Vice*
