Teaching and Learning Review

All Church of England primary schools have an SIA (School Improvement Advisor) allocated to them and their role is to support the Headteacher and school during the academic year. We also, like other Leeds schools, have an SIA allocated from Leeds City Council. As part of this support the Headteacher has the opportunity to ask at any time for a Teaching and Learning review to be carried out in school. This term I approached our

advisors from Leeds Diocese to carry out a T@L review in preparation for our expected SIAMS church inspection, which was due last year but delayed due to covid restrictions. Mrs Tringham and Mr Dudman both experienced ex Headteachers and senior advisors for Leeds Diocese visited Hawksworth on Wednesday to carry out the requested review.

They interviewed me, governors, staff, pupils and parents. They also visited all classes watching a number of lessons, talking to pupils and carrying out work/book scrutiny. Thankfully, there were many positives which included praise for teaching within school. They highlighted the exemplary teaching standards in Class 1, praised the teaching in Class 2 including an excellent Maths lesson, an exemplary maths word problem solving lesson in Class 3 and an engaging, innovative computing lesson in Class 4. Also highlighted was the great work of Mrs Oliver in her role as SENDCo, the excellent pastoral care and PSHE teaching provided by Mrs S. Gallagher our Learning Mentor and the outstanding level of expertise from our team of teaching assistants (which echoed the praise for which the TAs received during our last Ofsted inspection). They praised the child-led collective worship, the pupil's standard of work across a number of subjects and their confidence when talking about their lessons.

They also recognised the school's work on enhancing the curriculum, this term's recent strategy on reading development and the enhancement of assessment procedures for foundation subjects (Geography, Art, DT etc) across school.

Areas we need to continue to focus on are embedding the recent developments in the curriculum especially after the disruption of Covid and lockdowns. Another area is to continue the promotion of reading but to focus on the parental engagement with reading and homework especially with the older children.

I would like to thank parents and governors who took the time to talk to the advisors during their visit to Hawksworth.

Christingle

Performance 1: 9.15am start (school hall)



