Headteacher's Comment

As you may be aware, all Church Schools are subject to two cycles of inspection: OFSTED and SIAMS, unlike community schools which only have one cycle. A SIAMS inspection is basically the church's equivalent of OFSTED.

Our SIAMS inspection had been delayed due to covid, but I had predicted we would get the phone call very soon after Covid restrictions had been lifted. This was the case, and we were inspected on Wednesday. The inspector arrived at school at 7.40 am and stayed until 5.15 pm. He observed lessons, carried out pupil book scrutinies, checked minutes from Governor meetings and Headteacher monitoring files, read through school policies and assessment data, observed collective worship and interviewed pupils, staff and governors. Overall, it was a rigorous inspection, but the Governors and I are pleased with the outcome. The full report will hopefully be ready in approximately two weeks' time after a quality check by representatives at Church House, London. When I receive the report, I will send out a paper copy to all parents.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the children for being excellent ambassadors for the school, Mrs K. Loftus (Chair of Governors), Mrs E. Walton (Governor) and Father David (Governor) for setting aside time to be interviewed and attend meetings during the day. I would also like to thank Father David for leading an excellent and engaging Collective Worship on Wednesday morning. I would also like to thank those parents who took the time to speak to the inspector and a special thanks to every member of the staff team who worked so hard up to and during the inspection...I am truly blessed to have a staff who display an excellent team ethic and focus on making the educational and mental wellbeing provision for our pupils and school community the best it can be.

Staffing update

We have received a huge number of quality applicants for the Class 1 and Class 3 teaching posts. Following a four hour session reading through all the applications the governors and SLT have shortlisted twelve candidates and the interviews will be held next Monday and Tuesday. They will be observed teaching a lesson (Maths or English), complete an unseen task and an interview. I will share the outcome of the interview process with parents at the earliest opportunity. The successful candidates will join the school in September 2022.
