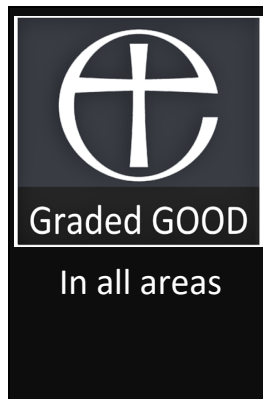

SIAMS



As you will be aware during the Spring half-term we had a visit from Mr Simon Stevens, an experienced inspector from SIAMS (The Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools). The inspection was carried out on Wednesday 23rd March 2022. The inspector arrived at school at 7.40 am and stayed until 5.15 pm. He observed lessons, carried out pupil book scrutinies, checked minutes from Governor meetings and Headteacher monitoring files, read through school policies and assessment data, observed collective worship and interviewed pupils, staff and governors. Overall, it was a rigorous inspection, but the Governors and I are pleased with the final outcome – **Good** in all areas. Easter Service

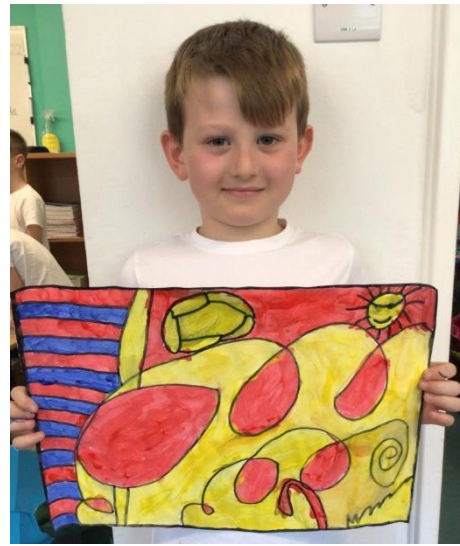
Class 2

We learnt about how to plant a seed correctly and what conditions a seed needs to flourish. In maths, we have learnt about the properties of 3D shapes. The children have really enjoyed learning about this! In literacy, we wrote a recount about our Easter holidays, designed a front cover for Jack and the Beanstalk and wrote a prediction about Jack and the Beanstalk. In art, we have been learning how to draw a range of flowers by following a step-by-step tutorial. Well done Class 2 for settling back into school quickly and working hard.
