As always it has been a busy week at Hawksworth! I have popped into a number of lessons this week and have been impressed with the work the children have been producing and the engaging lessons planned by the teachers. I have also been very impressed with the large number of children who have joined the school in recent weeks and how well they have settled into their new classes and how they have made friends quickly. We have a number of new families joining Hawksworth next half-term and I am confident they too will settle quickly, especially when our pupils are so welcoming to new arrivals.

As a school, we are proud to be able to maintain a high staffing ratio which enables us to provide planned support to all our pupils and we will hopefully be adding an additional teaching assistant to our staff. We have recently advertised this new Teaching Assistant post and have received a good number of applicants and I hope to make an appointment next week. I am also happy to announce Mrs A. Lees, our experienced Speech Therapist will continue to work with the school next year and provide specialised speech therapy support to those children who need it.

Yesterday, Karen Ross, our school photographer returned to school to take additional photos of each class. I had a quick look at these photos, and I am very pleased with the results.

In preparation for the upcoming Jubilee celebrations, the school has purchased a new (and larger) Union Jack which will replace the one that has been hanging from the flag post for a number of years. If there are any parents who have some long ladders to loan to school, it would be appreciated.

There is a ripple of enthusiasm going around the classroom at the moment, with children asking for more paper already. I can't wait to see what they produce as their final piece!
