Our School Curriculum

Ofsted, the school inspectorate, decided two years ago not to focus solely on SATs data in their inspections but to concentrate on curriculum provision. They believed many schools were narrowing the curriculum, squeezing out foundation subjects like music, DT, Art etc and just preparing their pupils to pass tests and not receiving a 'broad and balanced' curriculum.

Here, at Hawksworth we have always reviewed our curriculum and seen it as an evolving process. As a staff we started evaluating our curriculum during the first Covid lockdown and since then teachers have worked tirelessly developing our curriculum.

The staff and I didn't want to go for the easy option and purchase a commercial scheme as many schools do but develop our own bespoke curriculum (fulfilling our statutory requirements to the National Curriculum) for the needs of our pupils. 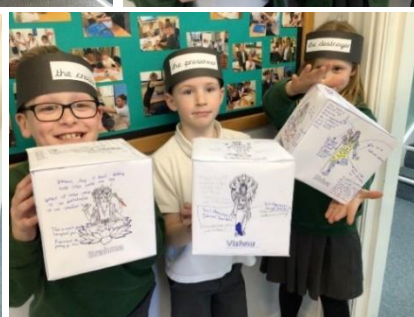

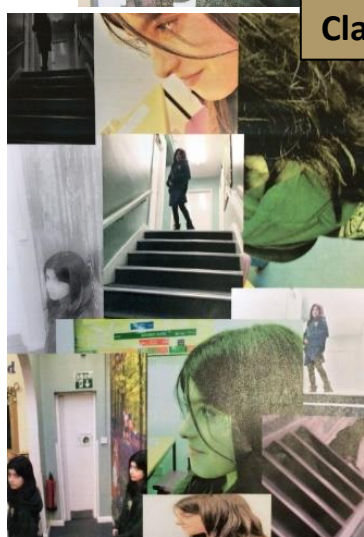
